<p>Do you plan on selling 1,000 Golden Tickets for people to have the right to build on the 60 acres in Hawkins County purchased in February 2025?</p>	<p>No, that is not a fair representation of the status of our enterprise.</p> <p>The kick-starter vision was posing 1,000 Golden Tickets for adoption, however, not just for Tennessee, and certainly not for our first property, which is (only) 60 acres.</p> <p>There are over fifty states in the USA, and we think big. We will open up the valve on the marketing of the initiative only once we are satisfied that the pace of the enterprise is balanced and in harmony with the turnkey project in Tennessee.</p> <p><u>Current Status:</u></p> <p>We have 50 Golden Ticket Members, with many of the donors/contributors actually more interested in supporting our global vision rather than moving to Tennessee.</p> <p>At present, we have strong interest from the first 5-10 committed families ready to move to our Hawkins County property.</p>
<p>How many residents do you intend to live on these 60 acres?</p>	<p>When we dream, we dream big, 40-50 unique families coming together to build a spiritually based gathering of relatives, which, in reality, is not to be rushed.</p> <p>We intend to start small and grow with and through community relationships to be able to accommodate those attracted to a harmonious life with respect for life, respect for earth, and respect for each other. This pasture was chosen partly because there is room to grow around it.</p> <p>We understand that our vision will take time to gestate and conceptualize. We envision starting with 5 potentially relocatable homes in harmony with current civic obligations and our relationship with and within the community.</p> <p>We anticipate sharing our plans as soon as they are visible. An incredible team is working on a master plan that deserves proper research and analysis to blend with Hawkins County gracefully.</p>

Please describe the demographics of your residents.	<p>Our Golden Ticket Members are 70% female, 30% male, with a median age of 60+, who are financially responsible. We envision a multi-generational community with young families, digital nomads, adding to the dynamics of the community as the amenities are supportive.</p> <p>For those around the globe who are grieving the loss of the dream of America, we have found it. It's in Tennessee, and we intend to have it resonate to and through the Earth in such a way that it touches you no matter where you are.</p>
Does the Micronation intend to abide by the laws and restrictions?	NewEarth Nation Coalition intends to abide by all laws in harmony with Nature and Nature's God.
Does the Micronation intend to pay taxes?	NewEarth Nation Coalition intends to pay every tax we owe.

Certainly, the NewEarth project will avail itself for knowledge and technology transfer to the local community.</p>
